## BOROUGH OF HONEY BROOK ORDINANCE NUMBER

An Ordinance by the Council of the Borough of Honey Brook, Chester County, Pennsylvania amending Chapter 10 of the Code of Ordinances, "Health and Safety", Part 2 "Grass, Weeds and Other Vegetation" by amending Section 10-201 "Vegetative Growth a nuisance Under Certain Conditions" as follows:

1. By deleting Section 10-201 and inserting the following in its place:

"No person, firm or corporation, owning or occupying any property within the Borough of Honey Brook shall permit any grass, weed, weed seeds or any vegetation whatsoever to grow or remain upon such property so as to exceed a height of 10 inches or to throw off any unpleasant or noxious odor or to conceal any filthy deposit or to create or produce pollen. Cultivated flowers and gardens, protected wildflowers, plants in designated wetland areas and floodplains, plants in storm water basins, shrubs, trees, edible plants and economically useful plants shall not be subject to the foregoing 10 inch height limitation and shall be permitted to produce pollen. Any grass, weeds, weed seed or other vegetation growing upon any premises in the Borough in violation of any of the provisions of this Section is hereby declared to be a nuisance and detrimental to the health, safety and cleanliness and comfort of the inhabitants of the Borough.

- 2. Except as modified by this Ordinance, the remainder of Chapter 10, Part 201 shall remain unmodified and in full force and effect.
- 3. This Ordinance is hereby incorporated into Part 10, Part 2 of the Code of Ordinances of the Borough of Honey Brook.

This Ordinance shall become effective on the date which is 5 days after its adoption.
