Honey Brook Food Pantry

Some recent information... The HBFP served 175 people at a pop-up distribution on 12/30/2020 bringing the total for December to 1,875 including 620 kids and the largest single day distribution in its seven years of service. This represents a 25% increase while new families seeking help increased by 50%. Close to 1,000 donated toys and hundreds of coats were also distributed.

Many local farmers and gardeners have provided some of their harvest to the food pantry and we hope to increase those donations again in 2021. Food pantry volunteers can pick up donations if needed.

Well over 900 people were served in January and once again the number of new registered families increased by 26% all trends that take us back to the March-April 2020 need for help.

VOLUNTEERS NEEDED - The increasing demand, both in terms of serving clients and processing the incoming shipments, has led to a shortage of volunteers, particularly those that are capable of lifting and carrying. We will need to find additional volunteers to meet that demand.

If you (or someone you know) is able to lift and carry up to 40 lbs. and can afford just two or three hours periodically, it would be a tremendous help.

Garden For Life Program – Volunteers Needed

The *Garden for Life Program* helps educate our participating families on how to grow their own healthy foods. The pantry supplies gardeners with plant seedlings, seeds, soil, containers and advice to grow some of their own produce at home. The community gardens provide a bounty of fresh vegetables that are distributed by the Honey Brook Food Pantry and available for anyone in the community. Last year we provided over 400 pounds of produce to the food pantry in addition to the uncountable amount of produce that volunteers and visitors to the gardens picked themselves between distributions.

Currently, there are two raised bed at the Honey Brook Township building and two raised beds at the Honey Brook Borough Community Park. Two more raised beds will be added to this location in the spring.

With six raised beds, the pantry will be in need of volunteers to help with planting, weeding, watering and harvesting at these locations. We encourage gardeners of any amount of experience to come out to help, days and times are flexible and there are always resources for help and information. Any level of gardening experience is welcome. No need to feel intimidated. No one will be on their own and it could be a great learning experience for families with kids or people who may want to start their own gardens in the future. This year the pantry is inviting clients to also help take care of the gardens.

This has been a very successful program led by Kris Chiappa. Kris is a Master Gardener and gardening enthusiast. She has done an outstanding job in past years and we are looking forward to her knowledge and leadership again this year.

Police Department Summer Safety Tips

Police Department Performs Vacation Checks For Residents

The Police Department will perform extra patrol for residents who are away on vacation to enhance the security of their property. A resident vacation form is available on the Borough website, www.honeybrookborough.net, Police Department page and can be completed and submitted on line. Residents can also print off of the website or pick one up at Borough Hall and return it to the Police Department.

Drivers Take Your Time

The Police Department is asking residents to be especially careful when driving Borough streets, as summer months bring an increase in pedestrian traffic, joggers, bikers and children playing outside.

Crimes of Convenience

The warmer weather and longer days tend to bring with them an increase in “Crimes of Convenience”, crimes in which the criminal receives little resistance. Examples would be theft due to unlocked or open doors and windows, and objects left visible in vehicles. Residents should only leave windows open on the second floor

and never leave a window open over a roof. Be sure to lock your car doors to prevent theft. Help us protect you and your property! Together we can maintain a safe community.

Door to Door Solicitation

The Honey Brook Borough Police Department would like to remind residents that door-to-door solicitation requires the purchase of a permit. Residents should not engage in sales activity with anyone failing to produce the proper Borough permit and official identification. The HBBPD is asking all residents to challenge anyone selling door-to-door to produce their permit and identification. Should anyone fail to produce their permit upon your request or act in a suspicious manner, please contact the police by calling 911 immediately.

Curfew

People under the age of 18 are not permitted on Borough streets or in parks or public places between 10:00 pm and 6:00 am unless accompanied by a parent or guardian. Exceptions to the Curfew Ordinance can be found in Chapter 6, Conduct, Part 1, 6-103 “Curfew; Exceptions” in the Borough Code. Violators are subject to a fine of up to \$500.

Concerts Are Back!!

MS4

MS4... What's That?

A Municipal Separate Storm Sewer System (MS4) is any municipal-owned stormwater conveyance or system of conveyances. i.e. Borough roads, ditches/swales, and stormwater pipes. Honey Brook Borough has to comply with the NPDES MS4 permit through 6 Minimum Control Measures (MCMs).

What is Honey Brook Borough Required to Do?

The stormwater requirements of the federal Clean Water Act and the National Pollution Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) are administered under the Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection (DEP) and implemented by DEP through the Municipal Separate Storm Sewer Systems (MS4) Program. Almost all municipalities (including East Brandywine) in Pennsylvania must have an MS4 permit.

Honey Brook Borough must comply with its MS4 permit through a robust stormwater management program, in order to improve stream and waterway quality. Federal regulations established 6 Minimum Control Measures (MCMs) that must be implemented through the MS4 program.

The six regulations are:

1. Public Education and Outreach
2. Public Participation and Involvement
3. Illicit Discharge Detection and Elimination
4. Construction Site Runoff Control
5. Post-Construction Stormwater Management in New Development and Redevelopment
6. Pollution Prevention and Good Housekeeping for Municipal Operations and Maintenance

Municipalities meet these MCM requirements through a series of Best Management Practices (BMPs) which are schedules of activities, prohibition of practices, structural controls, design criteria, maintenance procedures, and other management practices that reduce pollution to the waters of the Commonwealth.

PUBLIC WORKS

Spring and summer mowing is around the corner. It is illegal to discharge grass trimmings onto Borough streets. Discarded grass clippings clog water drains which require costly flushing at taxpayer expense. More importantly, the Borough must adhere to new stringent governmental storm water regulation contaminant levels which leave the Borough open to hefty government fines. Violators of this will be fined accordingly.

The Public Works Department is planning to complete some street work this summer which may require parking restrictions in areas of the Borough. Residents affected by this will be notified in advance.

Please be sure to keep your sidewalks free of hazardous cracks, grass, weeds and protruding tree roots. Shrubs and tree limbs should be trimmed to allow for a clear line of sight at cross traffic streets. Portable basketball nets and hockey nets are not permitted on the streets as they pose a safety hazard for pedestrians and vehicle traffic.

Street Sweeping

Friday, April 23, start time is between 6am and 7am.

Signs will be posted on streets for when cars should be moved.

CODES ENFORCEMENT

Residents are reminded that no trash bags or recyclables should be set out prior to 6:00 PM the evening before the scheduled collection. Trash bags should be removed from the curb by dusk on the day of collection. **PLEASE ENSURE ALL GREEN BAGS ARE TIED SECURELY.**

As a reminder, all pets are to be on a leash as outlined in Borough Ordinance 2-201. It is also unlawful to have pets in the Borough Park. Please be sure to clean up after your pet to help keep our Borough streets clean in accordance with Borough Ordinances 2-301 and 2-302.

Outdoor Safety

- » If you can hear thunder, you are within striking distance of lightning. Look for shelter inside a home, large building, or a hard-topped vehicle right away.
- » Do not go under trees for shelter. There is no place outside that is safe during a thunderstorm.
- » Wait at least 30 minutes after hearing the last clap of thunder before leaving your shelter.
- » Stay away from windows and doors. Stay off porches.
- » There is no safe place outside. Places with only a roof on sports fields, golf courses, and picnic areas are not safe during a lightning storm. Small sheds should not be used.
- » If a person is struck by lightning, call 9-1-1. Get medical help right away.

Indoor Safety

Turn off computers. Stay off corded phones, computers, and other things that put you in direct contact with electricity or plumbing. You can use a cell or cordless phone.

Do not wash your hands, bathe, shower, do laundry, or wash dishes.

“Name the Brook” Contest

Announced by the Honey Brook Community Partnership



See this sad stream? It is a stream without a name. Or rather, a very complicated name: “Unnamed Tributary #4 to an Unnamed Tributary to the West Branch of the Brandywine.”

That name is simply too long for the stream’s nametag. That’s why the Honey Brook Community Partnership is sponsoring a “Name the Brook” contest to name this 1.5-mile long stream that originates in Honey Brook Borough and winds through several properties in both the Borough and Township before emptying into an Unnamed Tributary to the West Branch of the Brandywine Creek. The stream’s route is on the map at the upper right. Eventually, the Brandywine winds its way to the Delaware River near Wilmington. No wonder Honey Brook is known as “the Headwaters of the Brandywine!”

The Partnership is looking for any person or group of people to submit suggestions for naming this stream. The top entries will then appear on a ballot for the entire community to vote on. Contest entry forms will be available on the Partnership website at hbpartnership.org beginning April 19. Each entry should identify name, contact information, proposed name for the stream, and historical significance of the name to the Honey Brook community. Deadline for stream name proposals is May 14.

The Name the Brook Committee will select a number of finalists for the community at large to vote on between May 17 and June 1. The winning name will be submitted on the application to the United States Geographic Names Board. Special recognition is in store for the one(s) who submit the winning name suggestion.

So, Honey Brookers, get those thinking caps on, and be ready to start submitting your suggestions on April 19!

WATER AUTHORITY

WATER NEWS

The Honey Brook Borough Authority decided at their January 5th, 2021 monthly meeting to change our water rates for 2021. The Service Charge will still be \$36.10 a quarter but it will not include the first 1,000 gallons of water that runs through a customer's meter. Now for every 1,000 gallons of water that runs through the water meter, a customer will be charged \$7.98. This change went into effect on each customer's April 1st, 2021 Quarterly Water Bill.

Continue to keep your home leak-free by repairing dripping faucets, shower heads and toilet flappers. Fixing these easily corrected household water leaks can save you hundreds of \$\$\$\$. Our Water System has four ground water wells that pump an average of 150,000 to 200,000 gallons of water a day. Our well on Suplee Road has a filtration plant that houses five large filters that are designed to remove Iron and Manganese from our water!

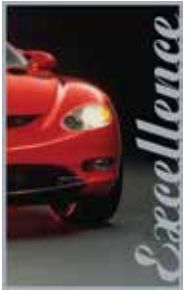
